Introduction

The PE Premium funding provides an excellent opportunity for the school to further improve its PE provision and to do so in the wider context of the Schools Sport Partnership, fully utilising the skills and experience across the group of schools.

School vision and aims

At Benhall, we believe that P.E. allows pupils to gain skills that are applicable across everyday life including teamwork, perseverance and problem solving skills. Pupils will develop their social, emotional and thinking skills throughout topics of P.E. Declarative knowledge and procedural knowledge are taught throughout lessons. As well as developing motor competence, we encourage pupils to take part in competitive games to understand the importance of playing by the rules, to develop strategies and tactics and to understand the feeling of winning and losing. We want children to engage in physical education throughout and beyond their time in school, to develop a love and passion for physical activity, and that they can understand the short-term and long-term benefits of exercise.

Key Objectives

For Benhall to achieve and maintain our vision, we will focus on the following areas:

- Ensure pupils participate in high-quality PE lessons that promote skill development and enjoyment.
- Provide a structured programme of intra- and inter-school sports competitions throughout the year.
- Enhance PE delivery through well-trained staff, ensuring consistently high standards across the school.
- Increase opportunities for structured physical activity during school hours, including playtimes and lunchtimes.
- Support pupils' mental health and wellbeing through outdoor activities such as gardening, play, and physical exercise.
- Equip pupils with the skills and confidence to enjoy cycling safely.
- Ensure all pupils meet the DfE's swimming and water safety requirements by the end of Year 6.



- Provide engaging outdoor physical activities tailored to the needs of EYFS pupils.
- Promote the importance of regular physical activity and healthy lifestyle choices.
- Develop and enhance playground spaces to encourage active, reflective, and social interactions during breaks.

Impact of PE and Sport Premium 2024/2025

Use of funding	Impact
Schools Sports Partnership subscription	The school entered over 15 sporting events this year. These included: football, netball, cricket, swimming, and others. All pupils from year 1 upwards attended at least three sporting event.
Get Set 4 PE subscription	Get Set 4 PE subscription used ensuring consistency and progress throughout all classes.
Equipment	Equipment used in PE lessons was updated to ensure the safety of pupils. It also ensured classes had enough equipment.
Travel costs	The school entered over 15 sporting events this year. These included: football, netball, cricket, swimming, and others. All pupils from year 1 upwards attended at least three sporting event.
Outdoor play equipment	Additional equipment for outdoor area purchase and pupils enjoyed their new equipment. This added to their progress in physical development.
Extra swimming sessions	Extra spaces were provided for swimming that enabled those who attended to swim 25m.
Maintenance of equipment	These were carried out and enabled pupils to use the equipment and partake in physical education lessons.
Subsidise residential trips	All pupils in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 had the opportunity to attend the residential.
Bikeability	All pupils in years 5 and 6 were offered the chance to obtain a certificate in bikeability.
Whole school trip	All pupils attended Pipers Vale to experience a professional gymnastics arena.
